



CAMPO Meeting Protocol

CAMPO's adopted Public Involvement Program describes a process for full involvement of all interested citizens, organizations and agencies prior to adoption action by the CAMPO Board. In order to have an effective public hearing tonight we ask that everyone conduct themselves in a civil manner with proper decorum. The following are our official procedures:

1. Everyone must comply with all University of Texas policies and procedures, including;

Hand Held Signs

- (a) Students, faculty and staff may display a sign on campus by holding or carrying it by hand or otherwise attaching it to their person. No advance permission is required.
 - (b) Any person holding or carrying a sign shall exercise due care to avoid bumping, hitting or injuring any other person.
 - (c) Any person holding or carrying a sign at a speech, performance or other event shall exercise due care to avoid blocking a view of any other person observing the speech, performance or event. Depending on the venue, this may mean that signs may be displayed only around the perimeter of a room or an audience.
 - (d) A law enforcement officer or the dean of students, or an usher or other University employee if authorized by officials responsible for managing the venue, may warn any person that his or her sign is being handled in violation of paragraph (b) or (c). If the violation persists after a clear warning, the law enforcement officer, dean, authorized usher, or other authorized employee may confiscate the sign.
2. Speakers should sign up before the subject agenda item begins.
 3. The meeting should be conducted in a manner that is respectful to Board members and citizens. Abusive personal comments will not be allowed.
 4. Testimony will be limited to only the issues in the agenda item, for example what do you support or not support in the draft CAMPO 2030 Plan? Testimony will be limited to only those issues over which CAMPO has responsibility.
 5. Testimony under Citizen Comment is limited to items not on the agenda.
