Transportation Performance Management

- Transportation Performance Management (TPM) is a federallymandated strategic approach that uses system information to inform investment and policy decisions to achieve national performance goals.
- CAMPO **utilizes the TPM process** through a variety of actions including:
 - Performance-based project selection
 - Setting regional targets
 - Monitoring investment progress and impact
 - Planning products including the TIP, RTP and studies




- The draft report will go to the Transportation Policy Board as information next month, return to TAC for recommendation, and adoption in March.

Spring Amendment Cycle

- The TIP and RTP are **amended on a regular basis** to ensure that the most up-to-date information is approved by the Transportation Policy Board.
- Amendments are processed administratively, through the next scheduled regular amendment cycle, or through an out-ofcycle amendment.
- Amendment requests can be submitted at any time through the online application with the cut-off date for inclusion in the Spring Amendment Cycle on January 28, 2022

2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program

- CAMPO is **developing the 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)** to be adopted in May 2022.
- Requests can be submitted at any time with the cut-off date for inclusion in the initial adoption on January 28, 2022
- The adoption of the 2023-2026 TIP does not include a concurrent call for projects, projects submitted for inclusion must have committed funding from federal, state or local sources.


Next CAMPO Project Call

- With the passage of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), CAMPO is intending on **beginning the project call process in late 2022**.
- This will include the refunding of remaining deferred projects and the selection of new projects through a call for projects for STBG and TASA funding.
- Sponsors should **begin identifying projects to submit** for this funding opportunity and begin the necessary development work for a successful submission.









Project Development Workshop

- CAMPO will be providing a project development workshop to help local sponsors prepare transportation projects for federal funding opportunities.
- This workshop will include information on the federal funding process, project scoping, cost estimation, engineering requirements and other aspects of project development that are critical to project implementation.
- Additional information and schedule will be provided in the coming months, but we encourage all local sponsor staff and representative consulting firms to attend.

An Act

To authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety programs, and transit programs, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

Additional Funding Opportunities

The IIHJA provides \$274 billion in new transportation funding. When added to baseline spending, the bill provides a total of \$567 billion in guaranteed transportation funding over five years in addition to new discretionary grant programs.

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Additional Funding Opportunities

IIJA provides funding for existing grant programs as well as creating a new competitive discretionary grant programs. These programs seek to fund projects that address:

- Resiliency
- Carbon reduction
- Charging infrastructure
- Safety
- Congestion relief
- Reconnecting communities
- Project development assistance

These programs are aiming to begin funding projects in 6 months however the federal process for program initiation will be challenging.
